

San Diego IRWM Updates Prop 50 Contract Administration All but one Local Project Sponsors (LPS) contract has been distributed for signatures An LPS Workshop was held on January 5th to answer contracting and invoicing questions First round of invoices and progress reports were due on January 19th San Diego IRWM contract is now 3% complete Invoices submitted by CoastKeeper, SDRPF, and SDCWA total \$812,000 (of \$25 million)

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Legislative Initiative

- City of San Diego and Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) are sponsoring a bill to:
 - Revise SWRCB's 303(d) Listing Policy and RWQCB's Water Quality Objectives to establish factors for man-made drinking source water reservoirs
 - SD IRWM and RWQCB to co-produce a study by June 2012 identifying ways that IRWM programs can inform and fortify Basin Planning efforts
