2013 IRWM Plan Overview 2 Chapter 9: Project Evaluation and Prioritization Overall edits made to: Define integration per Priorities and Metrics Workgroup Correct issues identified by Project Selection Workgroup and the RAC, such as giving points to projects that include "true" integration Ensure that projects are prioritized based on IRWM-identified priorities (Planning Study rec's, objectives, etc.) Provide flexibility in the scoring process and in the scoring criteria – specifics to be determined during each round of funding by the RWMG and the RAC
