







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Statewide IRWM Update

- Prop 1 IRWM Grant Program
 - DWR briefed Roundtable of Regions about possible changes to how program is operated
 - DWR presented potential solutions to perceived problems with process
 - San Diego RWMG, with Tri-County FACC partners, submitted comment letter to DWR
 - RAC Members were included in transmittal

DWR Observations on IRWM

- DWR Observed:
 - Some projects were not being funded because Regions scored marginally worse than neighbors
 - Some projects with questionable benefits were funded because included in applications with strong projects
 - Selected projects do not always address IRWM Plan goals and objectives
 - DWR has limited discretion in project evaluations in non-competitive Funding Areas

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Proposed Changes to IRWM

- DWR proposed changes to IRWM process:
 - Multi-step process
 - Meetings with Funding Areas to discuss needs
 - Applications to request 150% of available funds
 - Post-application meetings (Q&A sessions)
 - DWR selects individual projects from applications to achieve 100% of available funds
 - Reduced level of detail for budget and schedule; no work plan required

San Diego Funding Area Comments

- Tri-County FACC submitted comment letter to DWR on June 29:
 - Strongly oppose DWR selecting projects
 - Applying for 150% of grant funds disincentivizes DACs, NGOs, and smaller agencies (with smaller benefits) from participating
 - Intent of IRWM is cooperative solutions punishing FAs for funding agreements and removing local expertise to select projects undermines IRWM
 - Support multi-step process with Q&A session

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- Prop 1 IRWM Grant Program Schedule
 - Draft PSP for Prop 1-Round 1 in late 2017; applications due in Spring 2018
 - Prop 1-Round 2 in 2020
 - DWR plans to solicit DAC and general implementation projects jointly; majority of DAC funds available in Round 2
 - RWMG encouraged DWR to provide adequate time for the local project selection process

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



 - Updated Appendix G worksheets with example calculations


