Focus Area: Collaboration, Information Sharing, and Advocacy

Goal: Strengthen and expand partnerships with state and federal agencies and facilitate RAC members and IRWM Program stakeholders with meaningful engagement with water

Goal: Facilitate information sharing in the region that can lead to opportunities to address common challenges, share lessons learned, and advocate for common goals that impact water management in the region.

Focus Area: Funding

Goal: Identify and secure potential funding sources that support the goals of IRWM and enhance IRWM's capacity to improve water resources planning in the region. Position the region for success in funding endeavors.
